MISSIONARIES

YOUNG ADULTS IN GLOBAL MISSION (YAGM)

YAGM applications are accepted on a rolling basis, year-round. Those who apply by Feb. 1 will be considered for the service year beginning the following August. Priority will be given to those who apply by Jan. 15. To apply or learn more, visit ELCA.org/YAGM.

REFLECTION

"The churches of Asia send greetings. Aquila and Prisca, together with the church in their house, greet you warmly in the Lord. All the brothers and sisters send greetings. Greet one another with a holy kiss."—1 Corinthians 16:19-20.

The Roman province of Asia was located in what is now Turkey. This letter from the apostle Paul is a greeting to his fellow Corinthians — a greeting from one church to another, crossing the geographical landscape. As you see in this text, the early church already practiced sending messages of affection and fellowship from one region to another.

In January 2023, after nine hours traveling by bus, we arrived at the Esmeralda community of the Augustinian Lutheran Church in Guatemala. Many smiling faces and hugs welcomed us, and we were given a nice, hot meal. At dawn and after worship, our delegation divided so we could spend the night with different host families. In my conversation with my host, she named a person from a congregation in the United States who has stayed in her house several times over the years. My smile widened because I knew the person she was talking about. Then she continued to name others and said, "Please send them my greetings." At that precise moment I felt the holy kiss — the intimate relationship with God and the other.

Paul described Aquila and Prisca as fellow workers in Jesus Christ, and their mission and ministry were to open their house to receive others to pray and have fellowship. Since the ELCA's formation in 1988, it has supported global personnel serving with companion churches. Today, using the theology and practice of accompaniment, 101 mission personnel bring their unique gifts, a diverse, intergenerational community that circles the globe. Together, ELCA global personnel connect their service with ELCA communities and ministries. Through these relationships, global personnel create a space where our church meets "at their house," as Paul said. ELCA synods, congregations, members and churchwide programs not only become the supporting network accompanying mission personnel in prayers and fellowship but the recipients of warm greetings of peace and love from our sisters and brothers around the world.

Sometimes this togetherness expands in the journey of walking together, connecting us to someone else. Today's holy kiss could be a greeting, a hug, a hospitable act or a smile as we open our homes and community to others. It could even be the process of waiting for a relationship to develop.

The ELCA believes that the Holy Spirit calls us to serve in the world. I encourage you to pray for ELCA missionary personnel and to connect with one of them as the beginning of a new relationship in Christ.

A commitment to relationships of accountability that steward God's given gifts for the present and future.


INTERNATIONAL WOMEN LEADERS

The International Women Leaders (IWL) program supports emerging women leaders from the ELCA's global companion churches by offering full-tuition scholarships in partnership with ELCA colleges and universities in the United States. In the 2023-2024 school year there are 20 scholars at 11 schools. Like missionaries, IWL scholars share their skills and passions as part of our global community of faith, both in the United States and with their home communities. IWL is part of the International Leaders Program, which provides leadership experiences through scholarship grants and leadership development programming to students around the world.






